Commands

- Commands are sentences that tell you to do something.
- · They are bossy and often quite short sentences.
- Commands are often found as instructions (recipes, how to make things and so on).

 They end with a full stop or an exclamation mark if the command is urgent.

Task:


Write one command sentence to tell someone, or one of the animals what to do.

 starts with a capital letter and ends with a full stop or exclamation mark.

Exclamations

- Exclamations are sentences that express shock or surprise.
- They usually start with 'how' or 'what', but are not asking a question.
- Exclamation sentences always include a verb (doing or action word).
- · They end with an exclamation mark!


