One of his most iconic pieces of art was a print of Campbell's Soup cans




He also made prints and artwork about coca cola bottles

- Warhol created his early Pop art from images he enlarged using an opaque projector.
- This black and gray composition is an example of Warhol's "hand-painted Pop" and blends both Pop and abstraction.

- 1. Select a picture or photograph of an everyday item. You can print an image off of the internet or use a photograph or use images from magazines and newspapers.

You can do this a number of ways -

- Use baking parchment or grease proof paper to trace onto
- Hold the picture against a window and trace over with a blank sheet of paper stuck against it.
- Use a light box if you are lucky enough to have one
- Copy the picture free hand onto paper if you are confident
