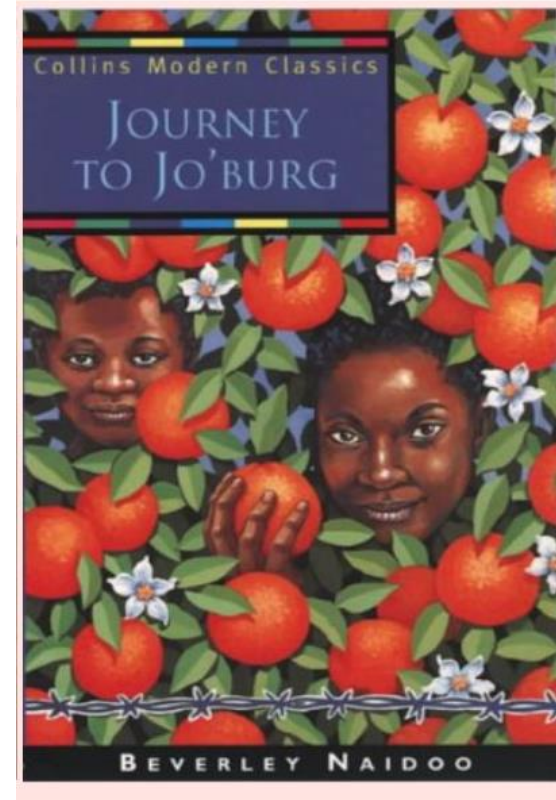

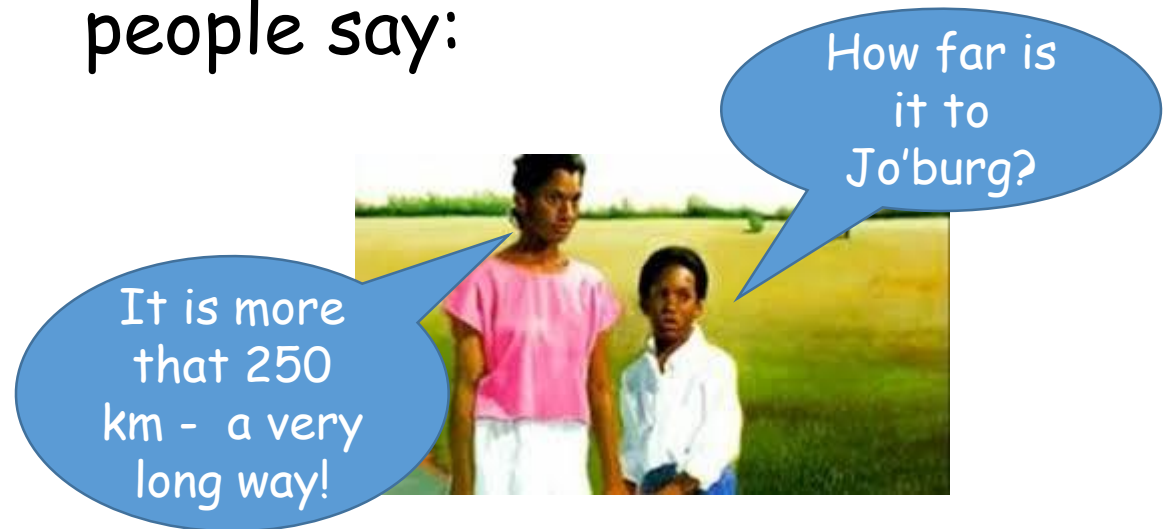
LO: To be able to use speech bubbles to recount an event.

There are two ways to show someone is talking.

- When we write a text we use speech marks around what the person is saying:
- When we write a storyboard or comic strip we use speech bubbles to record what people say:

"How far is it to Jo'Burg?" asked Tiro.

"It is more than 250km - a very long way," replied Naledi.



Let's read chapter 8

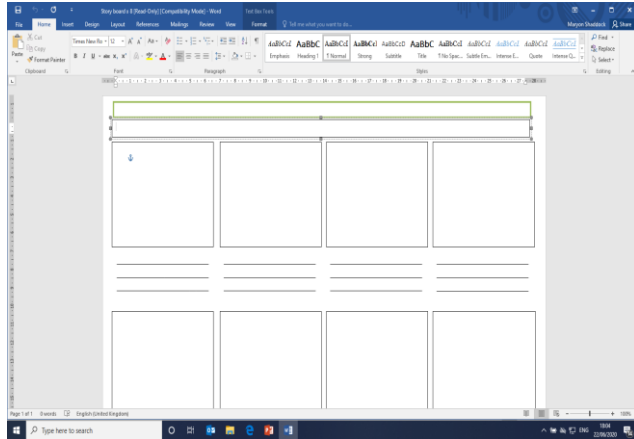
- As I read these chapters I want you to think of all the things that happen to the children as they go to Grace's home.



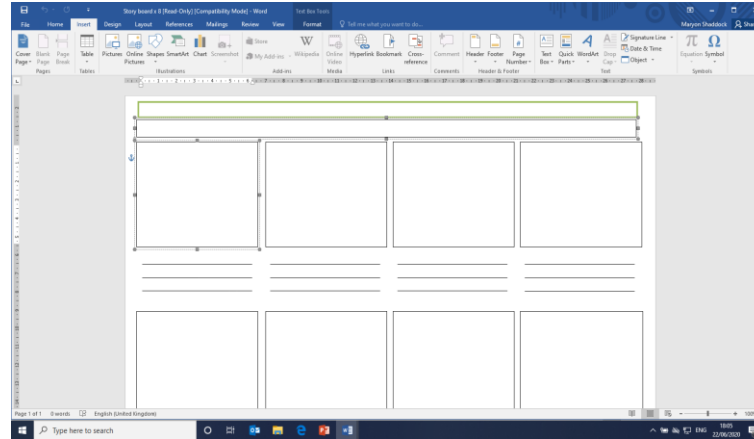
What happened on the journey?

- Grace found the children.

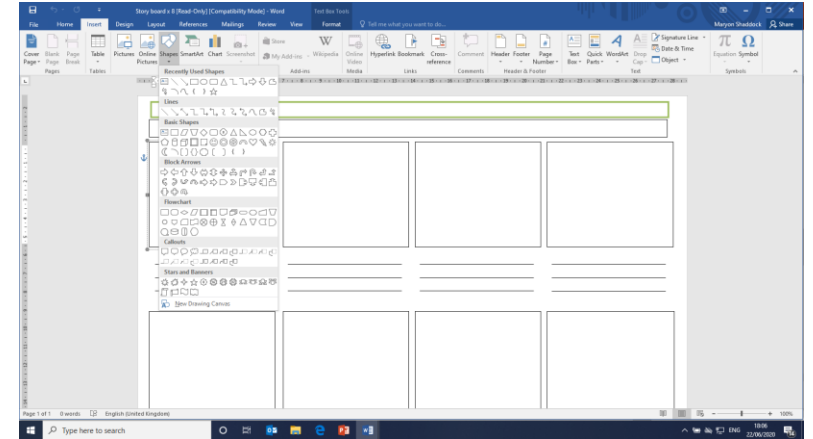
How to put in speech bubbles using word:



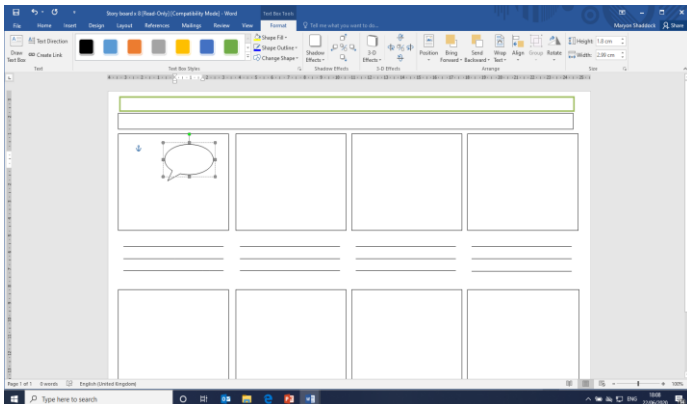
1. Open the storyboard in Word.



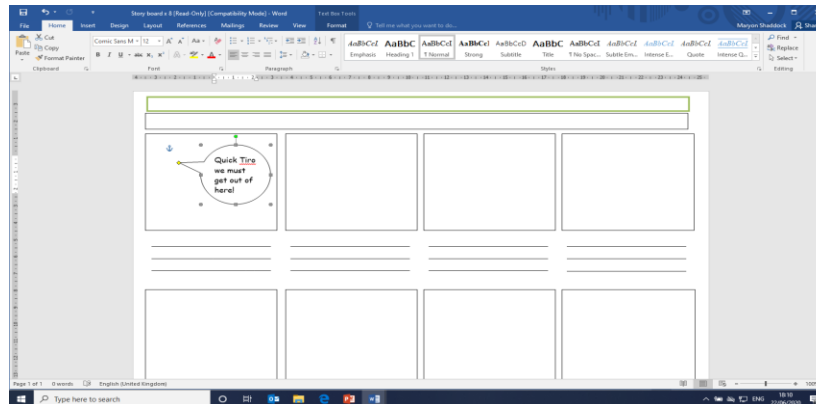
2. Click on the insert tab at the top of the screen.



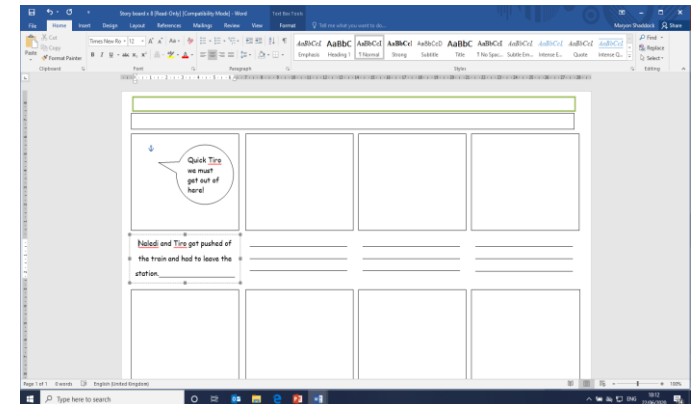
3. Click on shapes and then the speech bubble diagram.



4. Use the cross to draw your speech bubble. You can make it bigger by dragging the dots.



5. Click in the speech bubble to type the words that are spoken.



6. Use the lines underneath to add extra information about the story.
