


How are you? Mum told me you haven't been feeling very well. I have baked you some of your favourite cakes and wondered when it would be possible for me to come and visit?




Step 1 - Write your address in the top right hand corner of your letter.



Step 2 - Write the date underneath your address.



Step 3 - Write the name of the person who the letter is for below the date on the left hand side. Add a comma after the person's name.



Step 4 - Tell the person why you are writing to them and then add all the other things you want to tell them. Each new thing you talk about is a new paragraph.
