

## Covid-19 Related Absence Frequently Asked Questions - September 2020

What should I do if?	Action required	When can I return to school?
My child has Covid19 symptoms	<ul> <li>Your child must stay at home and self-isolate (along with the rest of the household)</li> <li>Contact school to inform us</li> <li>Book a test</li> </ul>	Once you have received a negative test result or 10 days after the symptoms first started.
My child tests positive for Covid19	<ul> <li>Your child must stay at home and self-isolate (along with the rest of the household)</li> <li>Contact school immediately to inform us of the result</li> </ul>	Ten days after the symptoms first started.
My child tests negative	Inform school immediately and agree when your child will return i.e. will they be returning that day or the next day	Once agreed with school, your child can come back straight away.
My child is poorly with symptoms not linked with Covid19	<ul> <li>Follow the school absence procedure</li> <li>Let school know as soon as possible</li> </ul>	Once the child feels better. With sickness/ diarrhoea, 48 hours after the last episode.
Someone you live with has Covid19 symptoms	<ul> <li>The whole household must self- isolate.</li> <li>The person with the symptoms should book a test straight away.</li> <li>Once you have received the results, notify the school straight away.</li> </ul>	Once the member of the household receives a negative test result If the member of the household tests positive, you must remain at home and self-isolate for 14 days.



Someone you live with has tested positive to Covid19	<ul> <li>Your child must stay at home and self-isolate (along with the rest of the household)</li> </ul>	Once 14 days of self-isolation have lapsed.
NHS test and trace have identified my child as being in close contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid19	<ul> <li>Your child must self- isolate for 14 days.</li> <li>You must notify school immediately to inform us.</li> </ul>	Once 14 days of self-isolation have lapsed.
NHS test and trace have identified someone you live with as being in close contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid19	The person who has been in close contact must self-isolate	Your child can come to school if they do not display any symptoms.
A sibling has been sent home to self-isolate due to a positive case in their school	<ul> <li>The sibling must self- isolate</li> </ul>	Your child can come to school if they do not display any symptoms.

## A reminder of the main symptoms:

- A high temperature you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
- A new, continuous cough coughing either a lot more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- A loss or change to your sense of taste and smell
