Key Stage 5 - Wrotham

Wrotham students studied a main learning aim of ASDAN Personal and Social Development at the appropriate level. Core curriculum was delivered by GP staff and students studied the appropriate pathway.

Up to 12 short courses were studied depending on the student and the Independent living carousel was successful in instilling independence in the students

Work placements included from McDonalds, Buttercups Goat Sanctuary, Holiday Inn, Communigrow, Stansted Primary School, IT department at Grange Park, Kitchen at Grange Park, Shears Green primary school, COOP supermarket. All students undertook some form of work placement whether internal or external.

College Carousel also took place with six students accessing the courses.

Key Stage 5 had 19 students on roll. 2 were non-attenders (Tribunals have taken place). These pupils have not been included in the statistics. One student (JB) was on a one-day timetable and one student (BW) left the cohort in Jan to undertake a support living placement.
