Grange Park School is becoming a Rights Respecting School.





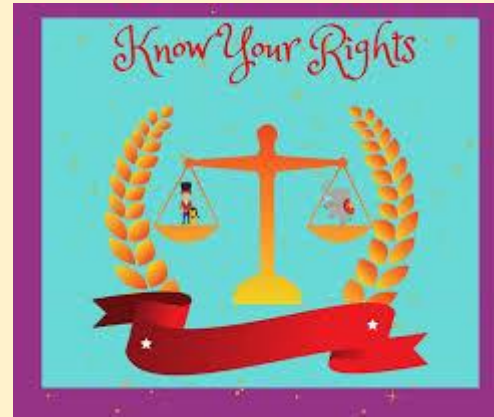
This means as a school we will ensure you know your rights as a child and will help to make sure your rights are met.
