The COP26 climate summit, one of the biggest ever world meetings on how to tackle climate change, is taking place between $31_{\text {st }}$ October and $12_{\text {th }}$ November 2021 and is being held in Glasgow. Prior to the summit, most countries set out their plans to reduce emissions. The Queen spoke out before the start of the event, saying she is irritated by the lack of progress on climate issues. The 95-year-old monarch spoke after the opening of the Senedd in Cardiff as she criticised those who "talk but don' $\dagger$ do".

Up to 25,000 people are expected in Glasgow, including world leaders, negotiators, and journalists. Tens of thousands of campaigners and businesses will also be there to hold events, network - and hold protests. At the end of the conference, some form of declaration is expected. Every country will be required to sign up and it could include specific commitments.
