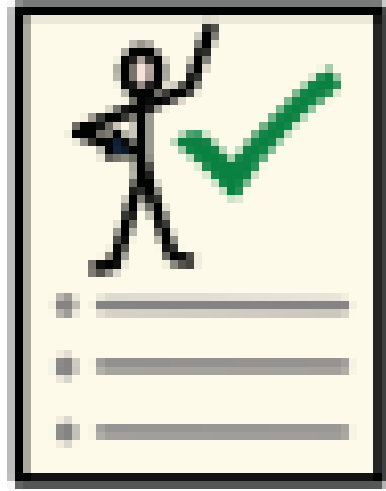


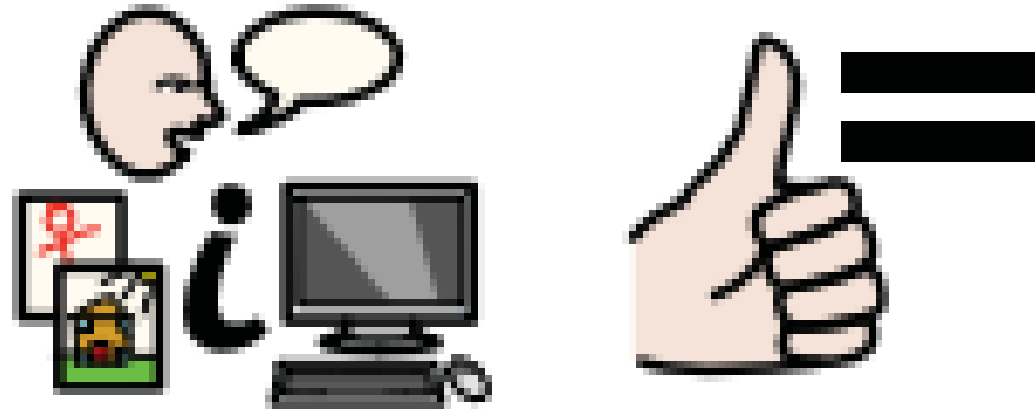

information.

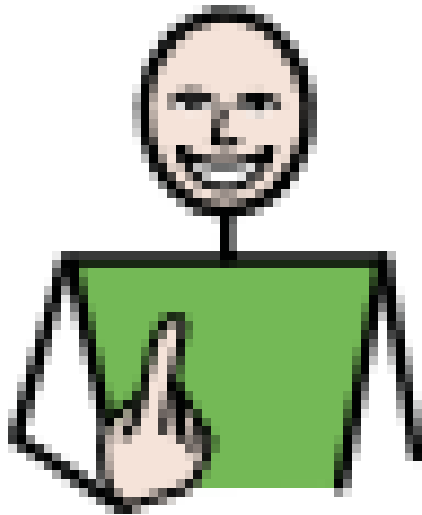


This includes the freedom to find, get and share information of all kinds.
