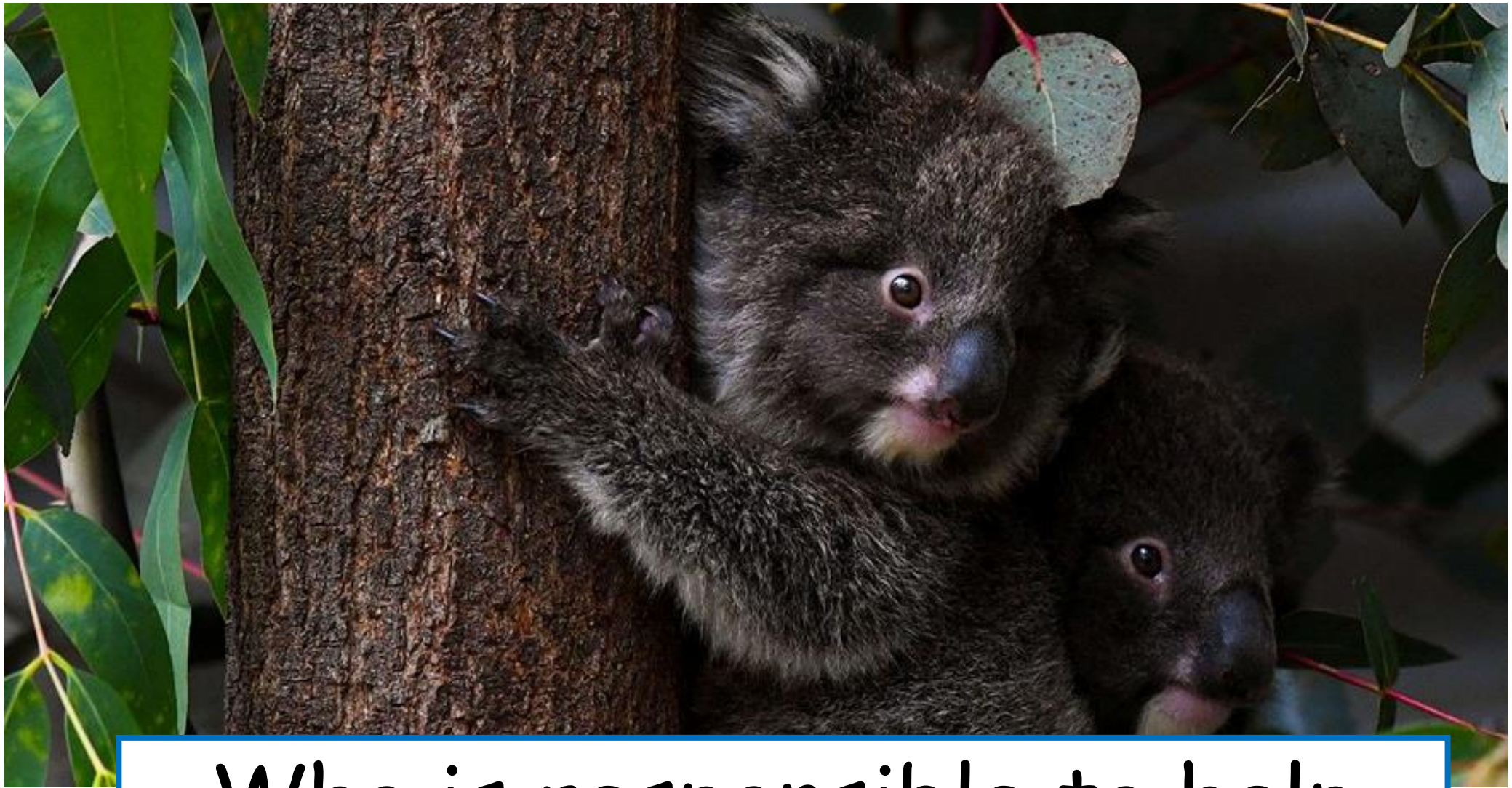
When adults are making decisions that affect me, I have a right to say what I think and be listened to.

Australia has announced that Koalas are now listed as an endangered Species across most of its east coast. In 2021, Australia conducted an inquiry which found out that koalas would be extinct by 2050 unless there was urgent action.

How can we help make a change?

- Are you aware of any other species that are currently classified as endangered? Some examples include, the giant panda, the orang-utan, and the stag beetle. Are you aware of any conservation efforts to protect these animals?
- Do you know some of the reasons why certain species have become endangered? Two of the main reasons are due to loss of habitat (this can happen naturally or due to human activity), the other is a lack of genetic variation in the species. How much control do you think we have over these? Do you think more should be done to prevent species being added to the endangered list in the first place?
