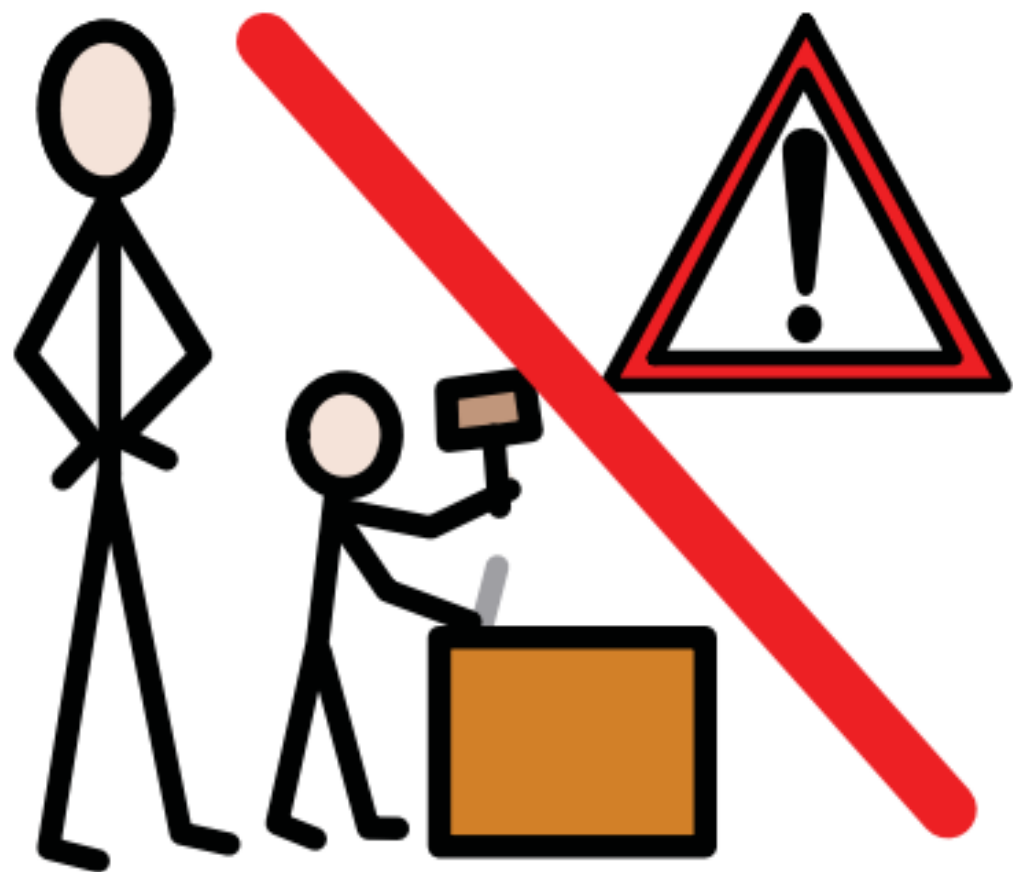

Question: If you keep trying, will you always succeed?

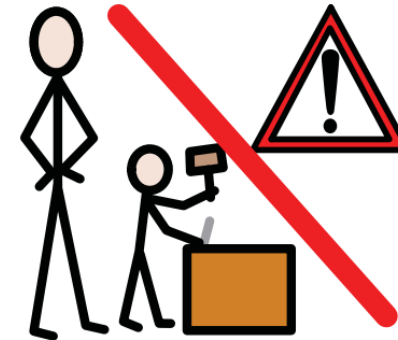


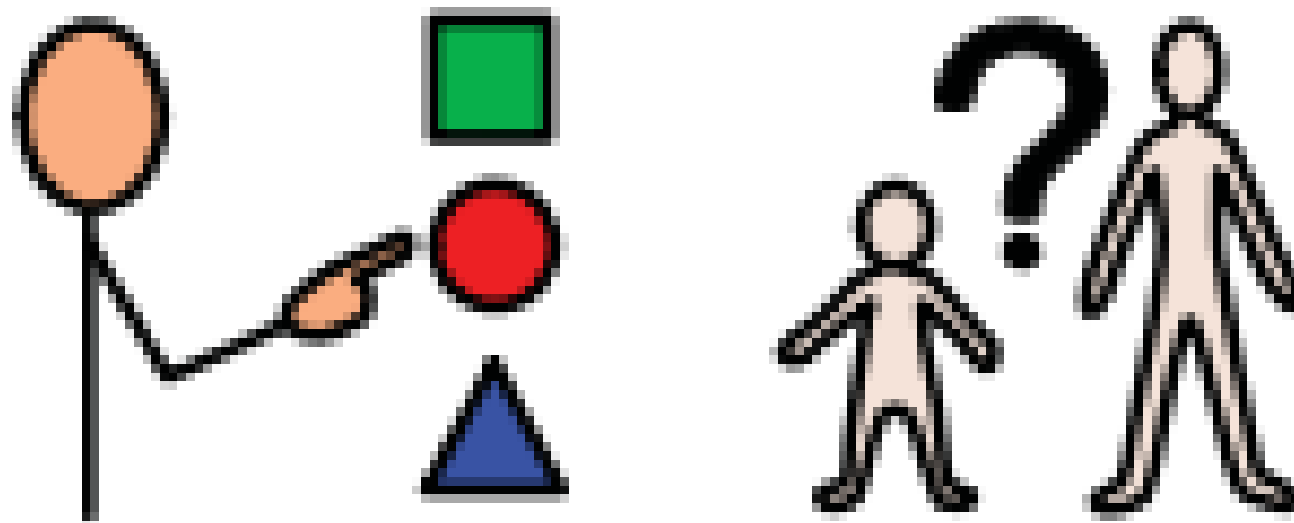
32. I should not be made to do dangerous work.

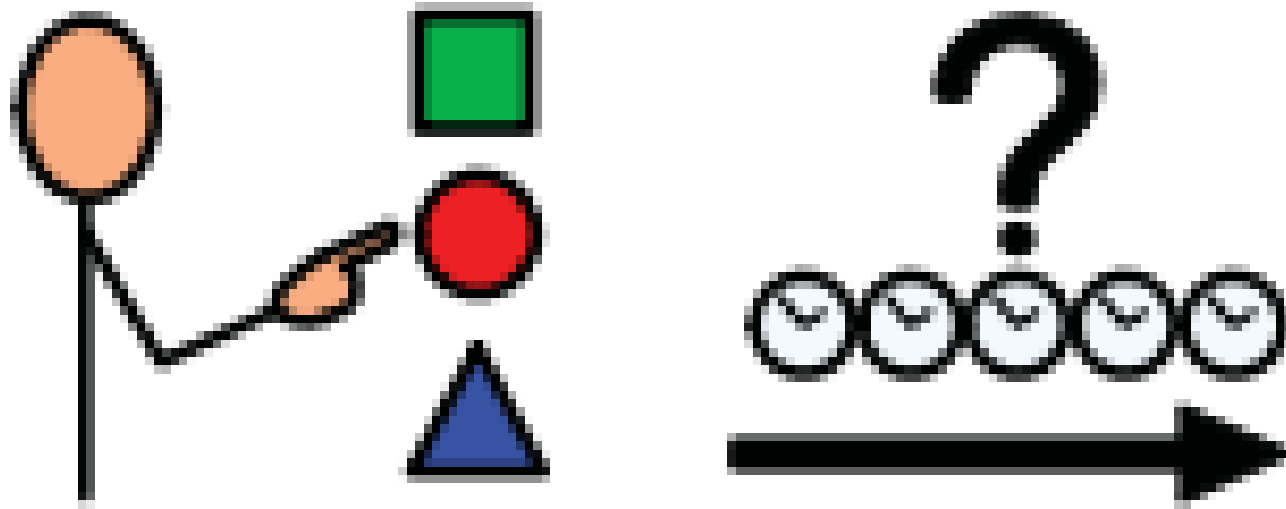

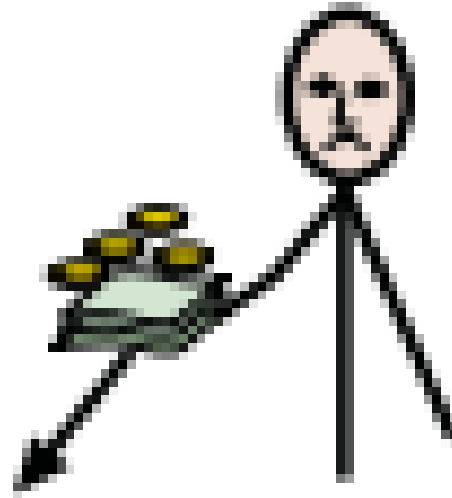




The Government should agree a minimum age for when I can start work.
