All pupils at Grange Park School have an Education Health Care Plan or a Statement of Special Educational Needs and a diagnosis of an Autism Spectrum Condition. This policy has been written to incorporate their needs, along with the legal guidelines and principles.

Grange Park School regularly reviews its policies. We will take steps as far as practically possible to adhere to the law and current guidance issued by the relevant regulatory bodies.

At Grange Park School we are ambitious for all our students to fulfil their potential as they move into adulthood. We will work with each student and their families and carers to support them, and enable them to make a successful transition towards adulthood.

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1. Introduction

This policy sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

2. Student Entitlement

Students in Years 8-14 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through curriculum evenings, employer talks, group discussions and taster events etc.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

The school will provide

- Two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 or 9) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 or 11) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'third key phase' (year 12 or 13) that are mandatory for the school to put on but optional for pupils to attend.

In the context of the provider access legislation, a provider is an organisation that offers approved technical education qualifications or their representative, for example an FE college or training provider.

The school and providers will work together and the school will ask each provider to provide information to pupils that, as a minimum, includes:

- information about the provider and the approved technical education qualifications or apprenticeships that the provider offers,
- information about the careers to which those technical education qualifications or apprenticeships might lead,

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- a description of what learning or training with the provider is like,
- responses to questions from the pupils about the provider or approved technical education qualifications and apprenticeships.

4. Premises and Facilities

- 4.1 The school will make the main hall, classrooms or private meeting room available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available any other specialist equipment to support provider presentations where possible. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a suitable member of staff
- 4.2 Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature which will be made available in our library under 'Careers', Careers-related resources are available to all students at lunch and break times.

5 Further Information

- 5.1 The school will work collaboratively with any provider and will also support in the visits to ensure the needs of the students are met in relation to their autism
- 5.2 Meaningful online engagement is also an option, and we are open to providers that are able to provide live online engagement with our students
- 5.3 If the provider is not satisfied with the support from the school then every effort will be made by the school to resolve the issue informally. The provider can raise a formal complaint if they are not satisfied with the informal process. The schools complaint policy is on the school website

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- 5.4 Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature
