Terms 1	Take One Picture art project with the National Gallery (2023)
	This years painting is <i>Surprised!</i> by Henri Rousseau.
	A project exploring and responding to a painting, art movement and artist. This term will focus on drawing nature and animals and capturing weather in art.
	Pupils are introduced to the painting from the National Gallery and create a piece of artwork in response. Pupils will
	have the opportunity to have their work submitted for display at the gallery in term 6. They will also visit the National
	Gallery in October as part of this project.
Term 2	Previous paintings include: <i>An Experiment on a Bird with an Air Pump</i> , by Joseph Wright of Derby, <i>Men of the Docks</i> by George Bellows, <i>The Finding of Moses</i> by Orazio Gentileschi, <i>The Battle of San Romano</i> by Paolo Uccello and <i>Shipwreck in a Stormy Sea</i> , by Claude-Joseph Vernet.

	Myths and Legends/History Painting (2023) Artists: Michelangelo, Leonardo da Vinci, Raphael, Titian and Caravaggio. This lends to art and classical studies/ancient art.		
	Portraiture and Genre Painting Artists: van Gogh, Rembrandt, Anthony van Dyke, Lucian Freud, Francis Bacon, Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Picasso, Gauguin, Kehinde Wiley, Cheri Samba.		
	Landscapes (including Architecture and Buildings) Artists: Monet, Turner, Gainsborough, Hockney, Louisa Hutton, Fashid Moussavi, Altoni Gaudi, Jock McFadyen		
	Animals – Rousseau, Matisse, Humphrey Ocean		
	Still Life and Nature – Cezanne, Andy Goldsworthy, Patrick Blanc, William Morris, Arts and Crafts		
	Additional genres will be introduced where applicable to coincide with these topics, enabling pupils to explore themes such as:		
	Architecture and Buildings, Surrealism, Pop Art, Impressionism, Digital Art, Modern Art and Installation art.		
	Examples of past projects include: Architecture and Buildings – Perspective and technical drawing, Plans, model making and construction. Architects - Renzo Piano and Tonkin Liu.		
	Influences from Around the World – Islamic art and Printing - Block printing, design, screen printing – Arthur Liberty, Leighton, Greco Roman Ceramics.		
	Investigating Patterns - digital art, printing and textiles – Timorous Beasties, William Morris, Arts and Crafts. Fantasy and Surrealism – drawing, painting, collage - Dali, Magritte, Paula Rego and Leonora Carrington		
Terms 5-6	Pop Art - Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Wayne Thiebauld, Keith Harring Jasper Johns. Project theme: Everyday Objects, Portraits, gender and LGBTQ+ in art
