


<u>Successes</u>

KS5 students have flexible transition from school to college, work or a different provision. The decision is made in consultation with the student and their family and based on individual need, ability, ambition and aspiration.

- Students in KS5 who transition to college receive a three-tier level of support when they commence their course dependent on their needs.
- Courses at college are also tailored to the students' interests where possible.
- Transition from School to College is planned in depth followed through with tiered and structured support once students start their course.



Hours are minimum levels of work experience.





Supported Internships

Supported internships are a structured study programme based primarily at an employer. They aim is for young people to achieve sustainable paid employment by equipping them with the skills they need for work, through learning in the workplace. Supported internships are unpaid, and last for a minimum of six months. Wherever possible, they support the young person to move into paid employment at the end of the programme. Alongside their time at the employer, young people complete a personalised study programme which includes the chance to study for relevant substantial qualifications, if appropriate, and English and maths


