

Key Stage 4 and 5 Exam Results and Qualifications 2022-2023

Across the Key Stage, students had the opportunity to gain 22 different accreditations across 15 subject areas.

100% of students entered for GCSE exams in Key Stage 4 achieved at least two GCSE passes.

Year 11 Exam results and Qualifications 2022-23

Grange Park Students had the opportunity to gain 18 different accreditations across 15 different subject areas in KS4. In the year 11 cohort there were 13 pupils. One of these had an adapted timetable due to her mental health needs and one only started in year 11. In this year group, only 9 out of the 13 pupils were able to sit SATS while they were in mainstream primary school, and only 2 of those were age expected at that time.

All Grange Park students gained qualifications in Maths and English and in other areas in line with their interests and ability level.

Destination- All students were able to access further education courses in line with expectations. Eleven students moved to Mid-Kent College as Grange Park students, one entered Key Stage 5 at Grange Park School and one student went to a mainstream college. 100% of Grange Park Year 11 students remained in education and/or employment, compared to a National Average of 93.90% for all Year 11 students, and 90.5% National Average for pupils with an EHCP.

Having built on last year's success where **all pupils** completed 3 GCSE courses this year all pupils gained 5 or more GCSE passes or their equivalent.

100% of pupils gained an accreditation in English Mathematics and Science

100% of pupils had at least five GCSE passes

100% of pupils had at least one good pass or higher

100% of pupils gained 5 or more GCSE passes (In 2019 only 50% of pupils sat any GCSEs)

100% of pupils achieved at least one grade 4 (or equivalent) pass

31% of pupils gained 5 or more grade 4 or above passes

Average number of accreditations per pupil was 10 (lowest was 6 for a pupil who had only been at GP for 1 year)

1 pupil gained English and Maths at grade 5 and 6 other good GCSE passes

100% of pupils gained a GCSE in English

92% of pupils gained a GCSE in Maths (1 pupil with a bespoke timetable due to her mental health did not but she did gain an Entry level Certificate Level 3 and successfully transitioned to college)

100% of pupils gained a GCSE in Science

85% of pupils gained 2 GCSEs in Science

54% of pupils gained 3 GCSEs in Science

Year 10 Exam Results and Qualifications 2022-2023

In Year 10, pupils had the opportunity to sit up to 4 GCSE exams early. Over the past 4 years, the number of Year 10 pupils sitting multiple GCSE exams has risen as we continue to build on the success of previous years. In this year group, 12 were able to sit SATs while they were in mainstream primary, and only 3 were age expected at that time.

For this group in Year 11, **100% (17) of pupils will be entered for GCSE English Language, GCSE Mathematics and GCSE Biology**. With 2 new pupils joining the cohort, **83%** of pupils will have been entered for at least 10 qualifications in total over the two years, with **100%** being entered for at least 7.

Out of 15 students in Year 10, 14 were entered for GCSE exams in Year 10. One pupil was not deemed ready for examinations due to her mental health.

Of the 14 pupils who were entered for early examinations;

100% of pupils had at least two GCSE passes.

79% of pupils achieved at least three GCSE passes.

43% of pupils achieved at least four GCSE passes.

50% of pupils achieved at least one Grade 4.

36% (5) of pupils achieved at least two Grade 4's.

29% (4) of pupils achieved at least three Grade 4's.

21% (3) of pupils achieved at least four Grades 4's.

14% (2) of pupils achieved at least four Grades 5's – these 2 pupils achieved Grade 5 or 6 in all their GCSE exams sat early.

Subject breakdown

100% of pupils passed GCSE Statistics, with **100%** of pupils achieving at least a grade 2, and **29%** (4) achieving a grade 4 or above.

100% of pupils passed GCSE Chemistry, with **43%** (6) of pupils achieving a 4 or above.

Of the 14 pupils entered for GCSE Chemistry, **58%** (8) were also entered for GCSE Physics.

Of those entered for GCSE Physics, **100%** (8) of pupils passed, with **100%** (8) of pupils achieving at least a grade 3. **63%** (5) of pupils achieve at least a grade 4.

Of the 9 pupils who were entered for English Literature

100% of pupils passed English Literature, with **100%** of pupils achieving at least a grade 2, and **40%** (4) of pupils gaining a 4 or above.

Conclusion

The curriculum is wide and varied

All students have the opportunity to achieve at Grange Park with teachers creatively finding subjects and accreditations that can inspire students to achieve at all ability ranges.

The curriculum which involves gaining qualifications in both year 10 and 11 is sufficiently flexible to allow all pupils to succeed even when they have personal challenges.

The curriculum is stretching the most able as well as being aspirational and achievable for those pupils who struggle more with their learning

The qualifications are built upon throughout the whole of Key Stage 4 with a stepped approach so students can develop.

Pupils are engaged and want to learn and the mix of practical learning as well as classroom based learning inspires the students to want to do well.

All pupils feel a sense of achievement.

Pupils are able to progress to the next step of their education.
